

# What if you don't have art materials at home?

Sometimes having limitations can make artists even more creative! The following ideas and examples involve just paper, pencil, pen, scissors, glue, found objects and some unusual 'paints' like teabags and coffee granules.

## Found surfaces

Draw on found paper  
Create interesting surfaces for drawing by collaging scraps of found paper together. The inside of a cereal box works well for paint.

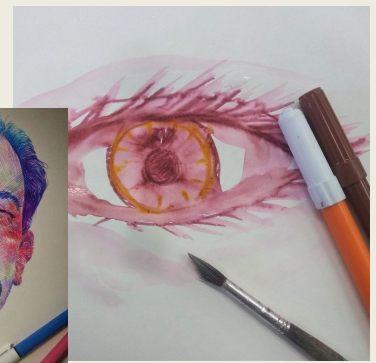


## Felt tips and biros

Draw with biro  
Draw with felt tip pens, sharpies or gel pens.  
Try drawing with felt tip pen and dissolving with water

## Mobile phones

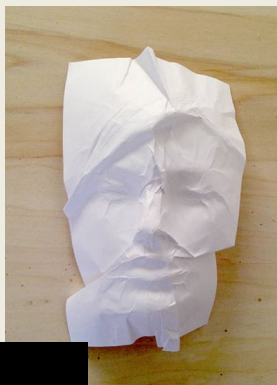
Take photographs with your phone  
Use free apps to edit and manipulate  
Print and collage or combine with other materials to make mixed-media photographs



## Tea and coffee

'Paint' with tea bags or coffee.  
Stain paper with tea or coffee before drawing on it.  
You could even use teabags as a surface to draw on!

Paper cutting, folding, rolling, moulding
