Discover The world: use the clues to guess what country this image is from!



1. This country has around 300 distinctive native ethnic groups.
2. Over 740 different languages and dialects spoken in the country
3. This country has the same flag as Monaco, but this country's is slightly wider.
4. This country has the second longest coastline in the world (over 54,000km), after Canada.
5. This country is the archipelago in the world. It consists of five major islands and about 30 smaller groups. There are total number of 17,508 islands of which about 6000 are inhabited.

1. This country is the largest hazelnut exporter in the world.
2. This country is one that occupies a unique geographic position, lying partly in Asia and partly in Europe.

5. This country gave the Dutch their world-famous tulips.

2. Around 97% of this country's population is home to people of European descent.

4. Over 10% of the world's flora is found in this country.
5. In this country political parties have their own brands of beer.

1. The world's largest salt flat (see image) is in this country.
2. This country is one of only two countries in its continent that is landlocked.

4. Indigenous people make up about two-thirds of its population.
5. This country is in a minority as one of the few countries in the world that does not have a McDonald's.

2. Largest number of vegetarians in the world

4. The climate in this country is mainly tropical. Mostly high temperatures and dry winters, tropical monsoon season from June to September
5. The world's largest producer of milk and the only country to have a Bill of Rights for cows.
