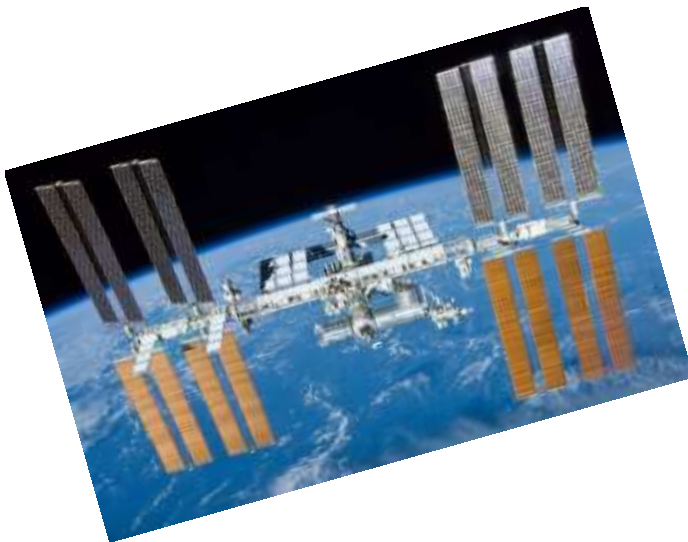




Spot The Station

International Space Station

The International Space Station – ISS is back over UK skies with some great evening passes during spring 2020. The ISS is the largest Space Station/ laboratory ever built! It can be spotted with the naked eye at certain times as it orbits Earth at 17,500mph at an altitude of roughly 200 miles. All you need to know is when and where the space station will be passing over your location. Luckily the United Kingdom is small enough for most of us who live here to see the ISS at the same time.

Make sure you give yourself plenty of time, get your cameras ready and enjoy the ISS as it passes over and keep your eyes peeled for meteors, satellites and other objects too, they will be visible most nights!
