1. This country is famous for its age-old carpets that are in great demand throughout the world.
2. This country is the first democratic state in the Islam-oriented countries.
3. This country is also known as "the Land of Fire".
4. Cotton and silk from this country are known all over the world since ages.
5. The capital city of this country is home to the world's largest KFC.





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1. About 7% of all the marble produced in the world comes from this country.
2. No one in this country can choose to not vote. Voting is required by law for every citizen who is 18 or older
3. The longest point anywhere in the country is only 85 miles from the coast
4. Currently men from this country must serve from one year to 18 months in any branch of the armed forces
5. This country is the leading producer of sea sponges.





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1. 10 % of the country's surface is covered in 5 national parks.
2. The oldest olive tree in the world resides in this country at over 2,000 years old
3. This country has a total of 117 beaches, along 294 kilometres of coastline
4. River Bojana is the only river in the world that flows *upstream*, due to its geographical configuration. It is also considered that the river has *two gorges*.
5. This country does not mint, issue or print euro coins or notes. It imports them from other countries that are part of the Eurozone.





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1. Lowest freedom of the press in the world, according to to reporters without borders
2. Just 8,900 people visited in 2019
3. From 1993 to 2017, citizens were provided with free electricity, water and natural gas
4. Opera was banned until 2006
5. Known as the North Korea of Central Asia





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1. Declared independence on 16th December 1991 - last Soviet State to declare independence
2. The people who live in this country represent more than 120 nationalities
3. People from this country believe that whistling a song inside a building will make you poor for the rest of your life.
4. The world's largest landlocked country but it still has a navy
5. Men do not normally shake a woman's hand in mixed company. Upon entering a room, they usually use both hands to shake hands with every other man in the room





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1. Largest oil reserves in the world
2. Population 29M (44th highest), but population density just 33.74/sq km (181st highest)
3. One of the most biodiverse countries in the world, but lost 8.3% of its forests between 1990 and 2005
4. Highest murder rate in the world - someone is murdered every 21 minutes
5. The colours of this country's flag are yellow, blue, and red: the yellow stands for land wealth, the blue for the sea that separates this country from Spain, and the red for the blood shed by the heroes of independence.





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1. The famine in the 1840s led to a population decline of two million people because of emigration and starvation
2. Known as the Emerald Isle, this is because of its lush greenery and rolling hills
3. The country's major exports include food products such as potatoes, lamb and beef. They also export a large amount of zinc, lead, machinery and pharmaceuticals
4. This country is known throughout the world for its vast amount of castles.
5. Hook Lighthouse is believed to be the oldest working lighthouse in Europe and possibly even the world.
