We have had an exciting start to half-term four with a variety of different activities taking place around the Lower Academy.

Our Year 9 students were each presented with a copy of their 2023-2024 Options Booklet on the last day prior to the break, which details all the option choices on offer for their transition to the Upper Academy. The choices provided are structured to offer a balanced curriculum that leads to post 16 higher level qualifications and university. It is an exciting period for our students as they complete taster sessions within enrichment lessons to provide them some insight into what each course entails. Their initial selection takes place over the coming fortnight and students can decide which Humanities subject they would like to continue studying alongside two further options from the offer.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, we have parental events running this half-term to showcase our EBacc curriculum. Both parental events on March 4th and March 18th will provide an opportunity for parents to tour the Lower Academy and, speak to staff about how they celebrate our EBacc curriculum within their lessons and gain a greater insight into our students' school experience. NHS Careers Workshop

Year 9 students recently participated in an NHS Careers Workshop led by Kate Evans from the Health & Care Academy.

Students learned about the diverse array of roles in the health sector, ranging from frontline healthcare professionals to administrative staff and, gained valuable insights into the skills and attributes necessary for success in these roles.

During the workshop, students had the opportunity to deepen their understanding of various healthcare roles by taking part in a hands-on exercise where they were tasked with matching job descriptions to corresponding job roles. Another notable activity demonstrated student's communication skills; team members provided instructions to one blindfolded team member to enable them build an object using playdough.

"I enjoyed the tasks during the workshop. It was interesting to find out about all the different job roles in the NHS and learn what they do specifically. I learned that there are also non-clinical jobs in the NHS such as accountants and even Art Managers. The workshop definitely made me consider an apprenticeship in the industry in the future." May.G


Swimming Pool Update

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the Contact Us page via the Basildon Lower Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)


