

Leadership Message - Attendance to Improve Outcomes

As we continue our journey through this school year, I want to take a moment to highlight the critical importance of consistent attendance. Every day in school is an opportunity for our students to flourish, learn, and connect with one another. When students are present, they are more likely to succeed, and better able to build meaningful relationships with their peers and staff.

We understand that life sometimes throws obstacles our way, but I would like to encourage families to work with us to ensure students attend school as much as possible. We have many layers of support that can be offered to enhance attendance in school.

As a staff body, emphasising the importance of regular attendance is a key priority for us. By working together, we can create a positive environment where every student feels engaged and inspired to attend school each day. To further support this, members of our school com-munity are reaching out to parents as points of contact, should you have any concerns that may impact your child's ability to attend school regularly. We appreciate your continued part-nership in helping us maintain a strong and supportive school community. Additionally, we will be launching coffee mornings to meet with families to discuss options of support we have to offer. This will be advertised in the coming weeks.

With attendance in mind, we are excited to introduce our new attendance rewards strategy, which will be implemented this half term. This initiative will offer a range of incentives for pos-itive attendance, with rewards given daily, weekly, half-termly, and termly to recognise and celebrate students' dedication to being present. Lower Academy Celebrates the Magic of Reading on World Book Day

On Thursday 6th March, the Lower Academy celebrated World Book Day 2025 through a range of different activities for students across all year groups to engage in.

The day begun with an assembly presentation, delivered to the students to explain the reasons behind the day, different ways to engage in reading and to introduce MC Grammar's RAP to the students, to set the tone for the day.

After break, students participated in an exciting World Book Day Quiz, featuring six competitive rounds focused on books and authors. The challenges included word searches, code breakers, and the fun task of identifying the Masked Reader, making for an engaging and interactive experience.



The day ended with all students taking part in a Jane Austen-themed afternoon, where they had the opportunity to learn more about the famous English writer, born 250 years ago this year, and experience extracts from her renowned novels. Their final task was to design a Jane Austen Memorial to celebrate her life's achievements and her significance as one of the named Houses of the Academy. Students have been asked to nominate their favourite designs within their classes, with the best ones in each year group being put forward for judging and prizes.

Students also received a £1 Book Token as part of the World Book Day celebrations.

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Health visitors are nurses or midwives who have chosen to gain additional training and qualifications. Their additional training enables them to assess the health needs of individuals, families and the wider community to promote good health and prevent illness.

In addition to families with children, you may also work with atrisk or deprived groups such as the homeless, addicts or travellers.
