

Leadership Message - Supporting Our EAL Students

EAL stands for English as an Additional Language, meaning that it includes all students who speak a home language other than English. EAL students make up 25% of our student cohort at the Basildon Lower Academy.

We strive to ensure that all of our EAL students feel included in school life and have the same opportunities as those who are native English speakers. New EAL students are offered a buddy within their class to ensure that they can navigate the school site with ease and ask them for help. Our EAL Ambassadors are also available to give tours to new EAL students and help them settle into school life at the Lower Academy.

Our goal is to ensure that students with English as an Additional Language (EAL) can fully participate in their education alongside native English speakers.

To support this, EAL students attend weekly intervention sessions designed to improve their English across the four key skills: reading, writing, listening, and speaking. During these sessions, students use a combination of grammar workbooks and the language learning platform LanguageNut to develop their skills further.



Where needed, students are also supported by translators to help them access the curriculum as their English improves. These tailored interventions and translation support help EAL students make rapid progress with their language development, allowing them to thrive across all subjects and achieve their full potential.

The potatoes have also begun to sprout, and two brand-new greenhouses have been installed, expanding the growing potential even further.

This incredible project has not gone unnoticed. The school has received nationally prestigious awards, including the RSPB Wild Challenge Award and Plastic Clever Schools recognition, highlighting our commitment to sustainability and environmental responsibility.



The wider community has also shown its support, with generous donations of garden equipment, seeds, and plants from local organisations, including The Basildon Round Table. Their contributions have helped make this project even more successful.



Important Notice: Smoke and Vape-Free Policy



Monday:	Choreography (Noun) chorégraphie in French Definition: The composition of dance sequences or movements. Example: International Dance Day celebrates the art of choreography and the creativity of dance.
Tuesday: International Dance Day	Rhythm (Noun) Rhythmus in German Image: Component of the dances performed on International Dance Day. Definition: A strong, regular, repeated pattern of movement or sound. Image: Component of the dances performed on International Dance Day.
Wednesday:	Kinetics(Noun) kinetik in Swedish Definition: The study of the effects of forces on the motion of bodies. Example: Understanding kinetics helps dancers enhance their movements on International Dance Day.
Thursday: <i>May Day</i>	Solidarity (Noun) dayanışma in Turkish Definition: Unity or agreement of feeling or action, especially among individuals with a common interest. Example: May Day represents solidarity among workers around the world.
Friday:	Labour (Noun) 노고, 수고 in Korean Definition: Work, especially physical work done for wages. Example: May Day is a celebration of the labour movement and the rights of workers.




Absence Procedures
