Inclusive education is at the heart of our academy ethos. We take pride in this commitment and firmly believe in providing every possible opportunity to help all children reach their full potential. Our staff actively create pathways to ensure that every student, regardless of vulnerability, disadvantage, or circumstance, can achieve success, participate fully, and progress within our school.

I see this positive engagement every day and am proud of our students that have recently enrolled in an intervention scheme called 'Validate It'.

Validate It really supports our inclusive ethos and student wellbeing. It creates a safe space for our young people to reflect on their relationships with their own bodies. The 7 week project validates bodies in all their different forms and prompts participants to celebrate all the things their bodies can do and feel. The scheme has also offered the opportunity for a gallery walk where the students were able to engage with a range of diverse role models and their journey to body acceptance.

Year 7 Explore the Life and Works of Charles Dickens

Year 7 students recently enjoyed a visit to the Charles Dickens Museum in London, the very house where the renowned author lived for two years and wrote the iconic novel *Oliver Twist*, which the students are currently studying.

The impressive five-story house, preserved to reflect the Victorian era, offered a captivating glimpse into the world of Charles Dickens. During the guided tour, students explored the rooms and learned about the history of the home, as well as the lives of Dickens and his family. They also had the opportunity to view a remarkable collection of artefacts, including first editions of his works, original manuscripts, and personal items owned by Dickens.

Adding an interactive twist to their visit, students worked in groups to take part in an escape room challenge inspired by *A Christmas Carol*, where they had to "unlock the hearts" of Ebenezer Scrooge and Jacob Marley. Monday: International Day for the Abolition of Slavery	Abolition (Noun) Definition: The action or an act of abolishing a system, practice, or institution, especially slavery. Example: The International Day for the Abolition of Slavery highlights the importance of continuing the fight for abolition.
Tuesday: International Day of Persons with Disabilities	Accessibility (Noun) Definition: The quality of being easily reached, entered, or used by people with disabilities. Example: Improving accessibility is crucial for ensuring that public spaces are usable by everyone on the International Day of Persons with Disabilities.
Wednesday:	Inclusion (Noun) Definition: The action or state of including or of being included within a group or structure. Example: The focus of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities is on promoting inclusion and equal opportunities.
Thursday: International Volunteer Day	Philanthropy (Noun) Definition: The desire to promote the welfare of others, expressed especially by the donation of money to good causes. Example: International Volunteer Day is an occasion to recognize the role of philanthropy in community service.
Friday: St. Nicholas Day	Patron (Noun) Definition: A person who gives financial or other support to a person, organization, cause, or activity. Example: St. Nicholas is the patron saint of children, and his day is celebrated with various charitable activities.

To report a student absence please visit the Contact Us page via the Basildon Lower Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parent/carers may be asked for medical evidence to support absences after 3 days or reoccurring absence patterns.
- Wherever possible, parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours. If this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.







A guide on claiming your voucher and booking activities

Step 1 - Open the email and click the green button









Step 2 - Select Continue with email and log in/sign up
