Academies Celebrates Pool's Grand Reopening with Paralympic Gold Medallist

The Basildon Academies Trust celebrated the grand opening of its newly refurbished Lower Academy swimming pool on June 24th, continuing its commitment to providing top-tier facilities for its students and the local community.

The refurbishment project, which took six months to complete, boasts state-of-the-art facilities and eco-friendly features. The project, undertaken by swimming pool specialists Centurion Leisure and construction company Herronway Ltd, included extensive upgrades to both the pool and the changing areas.



Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony with Paralympian Danny Crates

The highlight of the event was the ribbon-cutting ceremony led by Paralympian Gold Medallist Danny Crates. A fully qualified diving instructor, Crates not only formally opened the pool but also engaged with students in an inspiring talk and Q&A session. His presence added a touch of prestige to the celebration, motivating students and guests with his story of perseverance and success.


In recognition of their hard work, the committee was rewarded with a fun filled party day where they enjoyed face painting, drawing, scavenger hunts, and gardening activities.

Students Explore British Values with Local MPs at School Event

On Friday 28th June, Lower Academy students were given a unique opportunity to engage with three parliamentary candidates. Hosted at Cornelius Vermuyden School, the event also included representatives from local schools and featured discussions with the current Castle Point Conservative MP, and parliamentary candidates from Reform UK and the Labour Party.

The session began with each candidate presenting their viewpoints on critical political issues. Students listened as the speakers addressed topics such as immigration, the NHS, the skills and labour market, tuition fees and the environment. This was followed by a lively Q&A session where students posed insightful questions, demonstrating their engagement and understanding of the issues at hand including british values.

The highlight of the event was a mock election, where students casted their votes, simulating the electoral process.

The focus of this visit was to enable students to understand the importance of having their voice heard and having the experience of taking part in our democratic political system.

Job of the Week: Fashion Designer

What does a Fashion Designer do?

Fashion designers design and make clothing for clothing companies, retailers, and manufacturers. You'll often work closely with garment technologists and sample machinists. You'll work to design instructions (a 'brief'), analysing or predicting trends in fabrics, colours and shapes. You could also work with manufacturers (often based overseas) to make sure that designs are reproduced accurately.

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the Contact Us page via the Basildon Lower Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)
