What does a Choreographer do?

Choreographers create dance routines and movement sequences for dancers and other performers in a broad range of settings. They turn ideas into steps and fit movements to music. If you're self-employed, you'll spend time marketing yourself and dealing with your own tax and accounts. Running your own dance company can involve hiring staff and applying for funding.

What Qualifications do you need to do this job?

You'll need a high level of dance training and experience. Most choreographers start as professional dancers and many study dance at college or university.

You can often become an assistant choreographer after being a dance captain, who leads and rehearses other dancers but does not create the steps.

Absence Procedures

To report a student absence please visit the <u>Contact Us</u> page via the Basildon Lower Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)
