Leadership Message - Parental Engagement

As we work together to support your child's journey through Key Stage 3, I want to emphasise the crucial role that parental engagement plays in fostering a positive learning experience and academic success. Research shows that when parents are actively involved in their child's education, students tend to perform better academically, have higher self-esteem, and develop stronger problem-solving skills. At the Basildon Lower Academy, we are committed to building a collaborative and supportive environment that encourages you to engage with your child's learning journey.

During Key Stage 3, students experience significant changes in their academic and social lives as they transition from primary to secondary education. They are building essential skills and developing attitudes towards learning that will shape their future success. Your involvement at this stage helps reinforce the importance of education, supports their emotional wellbeing, and strengthens their resilience as they navigate these formative years.

Ways to Get Involved; Here are some ways you can stay connected and engaged with your child's education:

1. Stay Informed on Curriculum and School Events

- Keep up-to-date with our school website and newsletter to understand what your child is learning each term.
- Attend progress review events and other parental events to learn about our curriculum. These events also offer a chance to meet teachers and ask questions about how best to support your child.

2. Check-In Regularly with Your Child

- Discuss what they are learning and how they feel about their studies. Regular conversations can help you understand their strengths and areas where they may need more support.
- Be involved in setting realistic goals and celebrating their progress, whether in academic achievements or extracurricular activities.

3. Utilise Online Resources and Platforms

- We use the 'My Child At School' App to share behaviour and attendance information. Check in weekly to monitor your child's progress and stay informed.
- Encourage your child to use available online resources to supplement their learning at home. There are a variety of these that are used across different subject areas including MathsWatch, Kerboodle and Seneca.

4. Encourage Good Study Habits at Home

- Help your child establish a dedicated study space and set routines that balance study, rest, and recreation.
- Show interest in their assignments and, when appropriate, provide guidance without taking over.

Opportunities for your contribution and involvement are advertised on our newsletters, our website and often through reminder notification on the MCAS app. Throughout this year we will have opportunities through parent forum, parental drop-ins, SEND drop ins, progress review events, celebration events and parental workshops. I strongly encourage you to attend as many of these events as possible. We believe that, together, we can make a significant difference in your child's education and overall development. Thank you for your partnership and dedication to helping your child thrive in Key Stage 3!

Students Commemorate Remembrance Day Through Reflection and Learning

Lower Academy students recently took part in a range of meaningful activities, providing an opportunity to deepen their understanding of the past and the significance of Remembrance.

Students participated in an Information Hunt, where they explored historical sources to learn about the two World Wars and other significant global conflicts. They also engaged with war poetry, analysing the deeper meanings behind the verses, and look at Remembrance traditions, including how they are observed in the UK, and an exploration of war memorials from around the world.

Groups of students also designed commemorative posters and contributed to a Reflection Tree, writing personal messages that hung as a heartfelt reminder of those lost in conflict.


