#### **Leadership Message - Supporting Every Learner's Journey**

At the Basildon Academies, inclusion is more than a value, it's a daily commitment. One of the most powerful ways we live that commitment is through our Enhanced Provisions (EPs).

These carefully designed spaces support students who may be struggling in mainstream classrooms, not because they aren't capable, but because they need something different for a time. Some may be facing emotional challenges, struggling with anxiety, or finding it hard to regulate their behaviour. Others may need a smaller setting to rebuild confidence or reconnect with learning.

Our Enhanced Provisions provide:

- Small group teaching tailored to individual needs
- Key worker support to build trusting relationships and model emotional regulation
- Therapeutic and core strengths sessions focusing on resilience, respect, and affiliation
- Flexible timetables that reduce pressure while keeping students connected to their education
- Clear reintegration plans, so students can return to mainstream settings when ready

What makes this inclusive is that it isn't about separation, it's about scaffolding. By giving students the time, space, and support they need, we prepare them to step back into the mainstream classrooms with confidence and success.

#### Preparing for Year 10: Transition Weeks at the Upper Academy

We're excited to support your child as they prepare to move from Year 9 at the Lower Academy to Year 10 at the Upper Academy this July. To help with this important transition, students will take part in a structured two-week programme from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> – Friday 18<sup>th</sup> July 2025.

Highlights include:

- Taster lessons at the Upper Academy every Tuesday and Thursday.
- Subject-specific drop-down days and normal lessons at the Lower Academy on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, designed to support a smooth transition into Year 10.
- Free lunches provided on Upper Academy days.
- A chance to meet key staff, explore option subjects, and take part in assemblies and activities.
- A BLA leavers' assembly and shirt-signing and assembly at the end of the fortnight.




#### **Young Minds**
























#### **Students Share Their Gratitude on Thank a Teacher Day**

To report a student absence please visit the Contact Us page via the Basildon Lower Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parent/carers may be asked for medical evidence to support absences after 3 days or reoccurring absence patterns.
- Wherever possible, parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours. If this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
