Our Enhanced Provision is designed to provide the right support for students who need a different approach to thrive.

Our provisions are not only about academic learning but they focus on developing key emotional and social skills that help children succeed in education and beyond. Our work is guided by the 6 Core Strengths Programme, which form the foundation of resilience, confidence, and emotional well-being by covering:

- Attachment Strong relationships with trusted adults help children feel safe and supported.
- Regulation Learning how to manage emotions and respond calmly to challenges.
- Affiliation Building a sense of belonging through positive peer relationships.
- Awareness Developing an understanding of others' feelings, perspectives, and the impact of actions.
- Tolerance Learning to navigate differences and develop patience and empathy.
- Respect Encouraging positive choices and self-belief.

The Enhanced Provision provides small-group learning, structured emotional well-being support, and personalised strategies to help students feel more confident and engaged in their education.

There has been a heavy emphasis on the training and development of staff to support them in supporting students. Examples of this include extensive whole staff training in Trauma Perceptive Practice (TPP) and ensuring all key pastoral staff are mental health first aid trained to enable them to triage student need effectively.



Celebrating British Science Week

Last week, students across all year groups celebrated British Science Week with a variety of exciting, hands-on experiments and activities. From making slime to testing the pH of acids and alkalis, and even crafting their own bath bombs; the week was packed with fun and discovery.

A highlight of the week was Wednesday's drop-down afternoon, where students took a break from their usual timetable to engage in science quizzes and explore the history of the universe. These sessions sparked curiosity and allowed students to deepen their understanding of the world around them.

Throughout the week, students also participated in a range of interesting scientific experiments, including:

- Heart dissection offering a closer look at the structure and function of the heart.
- Can crushing gas pressure experiment demonstrating the effects of pressure and temperature changes.
- Flame testing students identified different metals by observing the unique colours produced when they were burned.
- Elephant Toothpaste students created an eruption of foam by rapidly breaking down hydrogen peroxide using yeast and warm water as a catalyst, showcasing the power of chemical reactions.

Monday: St. Patrick's Day	Folklore (Noun) mibeko in Lingala Definition: The traditional beliefs, customs, and stories of a community, passed through the generations by word of mouth. Example: St. Patrick's Day is steeped in Irish folklore, celebrating traditions and legends associated with the saint.		
Tuesday: Global Recycling Day	Sustainability (Noun) udržitelnost in Czech Definition: The ability to be maintained at a certain rate or level, particularly without depleting natural resources. Example: Global Recycling Day emphasises sustainability by encouraging practices that reduce waste and conserve resources.

Thursday: Spring Equinox	Equinox (Noun) điểm phân in Vietnamese Definition: The time when the sun crosses the plane of the Earth's equator, making day and night of approximately equal length Example: The Spring Equinox marks the beginning of spring, characterised by equal lengths of day and night.		
Friday: Red Nose Day	Fundraising (Noun) fondsenwerving in Dutch Definition: The act of collecting money for a particular cause or charity. Example: Red Nose Day involves extensive fundraising activities to support various charitable initiatives.

Each item will be priced at 50p with all proceeds going to Comic Relief.












